# 1. “Repurposing” EU animal welfare legislation



## 1.1 The on-going reform process



*“The coming years will be busy but also decisive for animal welfare.”*




Purpose: to “ensure a higher level of animal welfare” (F2F Strategy, p.8)

- On-farm directives (*general, pigs, calves, laying hens, broilers*)
- Transport & slaughter regulations
- Further species?

**Why is it challenging to achieve the purpose  
– a higher level of animal welfare –  
with the on-going legislative reforms?**

## 1.2 Conceptual challenges of AW legislation

## 1.3 Data availability: Challenges

Harmonised and comprehensive data on resources, management and the animal welfare status is not regularly available.

- **desk research** for publicly available harmonised data: EU statistics, grey literature (EU commissioned studies, EFSA), scientific literature
- **scope: 27 provisions** (on-farm n=16, transport n=5, slaughter n=6)

### Resources

#### Pigs: manipulable material

- litter-based systems: **Agricultural Census** (sample survey)
- wide-spread slatted systems: **expert assessments** on EU level (EFSA 2007)

### Management

#### Pigs: tail docking

- **expert assessments** on member-state level (Briyne et al. 2018; EFSA 2007)

### Laying hens: husbandry systems

- Common Market Organisation: cages **3**, barn/aviary **2**, free-range **1**, organic **0** (EC Statistics)

### Animal welfare status


#### Broilers: slaughterhouse data

- records are not accessible

## 1.3 Data availability: Hope

The European Commission (DG SANTE 2022)

- **acknowledges the need** for better data (resource-, management- and animal-based indicators)
- **gathers input** on *how* this data could be collected and *at what cost*
- **could include** better data collection in the upcoming **legislative proposals**






## 2.1 Current CAP policies (2023-2027)

## 2.2 Potential entry points for CAP repurposing

- align **CAP indicators** with concept of AW legislation (EEIG 2022) or establish **links to EFSA monitoring**





## 2.2 Potential entry points for CAP repurposing

- make CAP payments **conditional** on animal welfare status (animal-based indicators) **challenging!**




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## 2.2 Potential entry points for CAP repurposing

- make CAP payments **conditional** on animal welfare status (animal-based indicators) **challenging!**
  - freedom** to choose means **vs.** additional **risk** for farmers (PES: Engel 2016);  
→ **pilot study** pig tails: perceived risk can be prohibitive, **risk premiums** (Bergschmidt 2019)
  - determine appropriate **levels of payments**: payment **differentiation** e.g. according to provision costs?  
(PES: Engel 2016; Stygar et al. 2022; Niemi et al. 2021)
  - determine animal welfare **thresholds** (Bergschmidt et al. 2021)



# Conclusions


## Part 1: “Repurposing” EU animal welfare legislation

- Animal welfare is a **challenging concept**: Legislation has to account for resources, management and effects on animals.
- Harmonised EU animal welfare data** is not regularly available but the window for improvement is open.



## Part 2: Repurposing CAP support for animal welfare

- The CAP 2023-2027 does **not align financial support** with resources, management and effects on animals.
- Potential entry points** for CAP repurposing:
  - CAP performance indicators
  - payments conditional on animal welfare status
